

Rules and Conditions of Entry

Shooters must obey all range commands given by the Range Officers.

The Organisers decisions are final.

N.S.R.A, NRA and/or Y.S.R & P A rules will apply.

Airguns that are held on a FAC will compete in competitions 1,2 & 3.

All competitions will be shot from the standing position

Competitors may not gain an unfair advantage by touching the bench/
side screens, infringements will be dealt with following a warning.

Breech flags must be in all rifle/pistol breeches, when not in use.

(These will be on sale at reception cost 50p)

Ear defenders must be worn on the firing point. Shooting glasses are recommended.

No one may enter the firing range without permission from a range officer.

Firearms must remain cased until told to uncase by the RCO

When on the firing point all guns must be pointed down the range

If any competitor finishes their detail early, he/she may stand back from the firing point, but no equipment may be packed away until the detail has finished and the ALL CLEAR has been announced.

Competitors must not talk on the range whilst shooting is in progress

Shot cards to be handed to the scorers as soon as possible for scoring

If competitors do not wish to shoot consecutive details, will they please remove their equipment from the firing point to allow other shooters to compete.

Mobile phones must be switched off/mute whilst on the firing point.

Gun Specifications:

Lightweight sport rifles must conform to NSRA Rules 8.2.3 & 8.3.3

All rifles must be capable of supporting a 500g trigger weight and will be checked for compliance. Failure will mean the competitor is ineligible for prizes.

A shooting glove may be used; no other specialist shooting clothing or boots may be worn or used.

Maximum weight of rifle is 4.5 kg inclusive of glove. This may also be checked.

.22 long barrelled pistols may use red dot sights. There is no minimum trigger weight for LBP's but must be safe to use.

The event is open to:

.22in calibre cartridge lightweight rifles

.22in calibre or less lightweight air rifles

.22in calibre long barrelled pistols

Timetable (the meeting is unsquaded)

0930 to 1230 - Precision events
1230 to 1300 - Standard event
1330 to 1400 - Rapid event
1400 to 1600 - Precision events.

Details will be a maximum of 15 minutes. Max 5 minutes detail change.
Each competition will require 2-3 details to shoot, (apart from comps 4 and 5).

Arriving early is recommended to ensure adequate time for shooting

Events

LWR (cartridge) - any sights

Comp. 1: 30 shots @ 25 yards. 10 on each of 3 x PL 14 targets.
Comp. 2: 40 shots @ 50 metres. 20 on each of 2 x PL 7 targets.
Comp. 3: Aggregate of comps 1 and 2

Standard Match - 30 shots @ 25 yards

Comp. 4: Sighting series of 5 shots in 150 seconds
2 series of 5 shots in 150 seconds per series at 1 x PL 12 target.
2 series of 5 shots in 20 seconds per series at 1 x PL 12 target.
2 series of 5 shots in 10 seconds per series at 1 x PL 12 target.

Rapid Match (formerly Duelling) – 30 shots at 20 yards

Comp 5 6 series of 5 shots on PL12 targets. 2 series per target.
Each series consists of 5 x 3 second exposures with 7 second intervals. Start position is gun in shoulder at 45 degrees, returning to start position between exposures. The competition will be preceded by a sighting series.

Action Aggregate

Comp 6 Aggregate of comps 4 and 5

LWR (Air) - any sights

Comp.7: 30 shots @ 20 yards. 10 on each of 3 x PL 14 targets.
Comp 8: 40 shots @ 50 metres. 20 on each of 2 x PL 7 targets
Comp 9: Aggregate of comps 7 and 8

PISTOL Event

Comp. 10: 40 shots @ 50 metres. 20 on each of 2 x PL 7 targets.

Classification

Competitions will be shot in classes as follows:

Average 90 and over, class A

Average 84 and under 90, class B

Average under 84, class C

For events 4, 5, 6 there will be only classes A (90+) & B, Comp 10 may be 1 or 2 classes depending on entry.

Averages

The submitted averages should be based on the best 5 of the last 6 competition scores achieved as follows:

Cartridge LWR and pistols on PL7 at 50m or PL14 at 20 yards

Air LWR on PL14 at 20yds

Note: Competitors who participated in the YSR&PA event held in September 2008 will be classified according to the averages they achieved at the distances stated above.

Prizes.

Awarded as follows:

An annual trophy to each Precision aggregate winner in each class.
Medals or plaques to 1st, 2nd and 3rd places in each class (subject to there being sufficient numbers) in each competition, plus:

Top Lady competitor

Top Junior competitor

Top Veteran competitor

JUNIORS must be under 18 years of age on the day of the shoot.

VETERANS must be 60 years of age and over on the day of the shoot.

The YORKSHIRE LIGHTWEIGHT SPORTING RIFLE CHAMPION (the highest scoring shooter who resides in Yorkshire) will also receive a Trophy and Cloth Badge
